Experiment with a paper bag or balloon to see how much air it will hold. What will happen if you put too much air into the bag or balloon? Write at least 3 sentences about your experiment.	Construct an invention out of things you have at home. Experiment with different ways to use your materials. Some things to start with are sponges, clothespins, empty containers, and cardboard.	Develop and test an experiment that shows how gravity works. Write about your experiment using scientific words.	What facts do you need to decide whether someone is older or younger than you? Record the ages of your friends or family, youngest to oldest, on a timeline.	Using Legos, blocks, Magna-Tiles, or cardboard boxes, build your room. Be sure to include your furniture and favorite toys!
Look through magazines and find pictures of different pets. Glue the pictures onto a piece of poster board and make an animal poster!	What does it mean when someone says, "It's raining cats and dogs?" Explain what it means in your own words. Then draw a picture of what it might look like if it really rained cats and dogs.	What changes would you make to turn a snow sled into a "road sled?" Use modeling clay, dough, or objects around your house to build a model of your road sled.	Farmer Fred has a very large vegetable garden. Draw pictures of at least ten vegetables that he might plant in his garden.	Carefully study a picture or photograph. Now, move the picture out of sight and see how many details you can remember. Make a list or draw those details.
Develop a plan to escape from your house during a fire. Draw your house and write your plan down. Share it with your family and try it out.	Brainstorm a list of ways that you could communicate with other people if you lost your voice for a day. Choose one method of communication to use for one hour.	Make a sign that would show the main idea of these words: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sunny weather</li> <li>Road closed</li> <li>Animal crossing</li> </ul>	Explain the importance of eating a healthy breakfast. Look through magazines and cut out pictures of healthy breakfast foods. Make a poster with your pictures.	Using marshmallows and toothpicks, build a cube, pyramid, and a rectangular prism. If you haven't eaten all the marshmallows, try to build a tower.
